PROPOSITION A: "Adding a tract of land located in the City of Willow Park, Texas, and adjacent territory, to Parker County Emergency Services District No. 1. For or Against

- A vote FOR Proposition A means the voter SUPPORTS selling the Willow Park Fire Department to ESD1.
- If you do NOT want to sell the Willow Park Fire Department, vote AGAINST this proposition.
- As documented in the 11 October 2022 Willow Park City Council Meeting the MAIN PURPOSE of selling the Willow Park Fire and Rescue Department to the acquire the funds to build a new Willow Park City Hall.

PROPOSITION B: "The tract of land located in the City of Willow Park, Texas, and adjacent territory, assuming its proportionate share of the outstanding debts and taxes of the Parker County Emergency Services District No. 1, if it is added to the District. For or Against

- During his presentations on 09 August 2022 and on 17 August, 2022, Parker County ESD1 Fire Chief Watson indicated very rarely do the citizens elect to assume the ESD1 debt; in other words, most citizens vote AGAINST Proposition B. If Willow Park does not assume the ESD1 debt, it is an accounting chore for ESD1.
